Submissions to *MACLAS: Latin American Essays*

We, the editors, invite submission of papers presented at the XXVI Annual Conference of the Middle Atlantic Council on Latin American Studies at Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, VA, April 8-9, 2005 for Volume XIX of *MACLAS: Latin American Essays*.

Deadline for submission is August 1, 2005. Submission should be within the normal length parameters of the respective disciplines and will be rejected if the length is excessive. Send one hard copy and one diskette (or email attachment) in a Word File (.doc) or a Rich Text File (.rtf) to:

Literary articles from MACLAS are listed in the *MLA Bibliography*. Copies of back issues of the journal are available at the Library of Congress. Essays will also be available from The Gale Group, 362 Lakeside Drive, Foster City, CA 94404. After you submit your article, a team of four reviewers will review it. The reviewers may vary by discipline. You should receive notice of the status of your submission by the first of the year.

Languages of submission include English, Spanish, Portuguese, and French. If you provide translations of phrases or sentences, set them off within parentheses.

Humanities contributors should follow the MLA format outlined in *The MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers*, fourth edition. See especially Chapter Five, pages 183-205. Social science contributors should use in-text citation format customary to the discipline. If your discipline customarily employs a different note style, kindly make the *MACLAS* editors aware of the style format you are following.

Proofread before submission. THE EDITORS CUSTOMARILY REJECT ARTICLES WHICH ARE NOT SUBMITTED IN A PROFESSIONAL FORMAT WITH CORRECT GRAMMAR AND SPELLING. WE EXPECT TO RECEIVE YOUR FINAL COPY, NOT A "WORKING" PAPER.
